

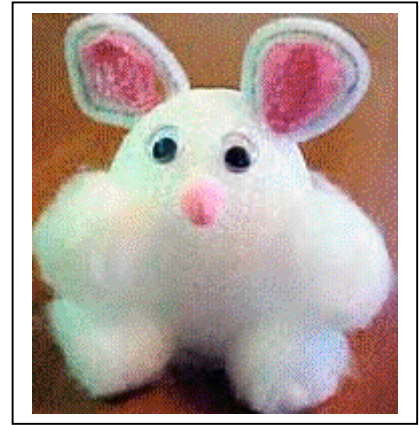
Easter Bunny

This makes a great Cub Scout or other group craft. Parental supervision is recommended with use of wire cutters.

This project is rated EASY to do.

What You Need

- Cotton balls
- Styrofoam egg
- White chenille stem (pipe cleaner)
- Thicker pink chenille stem (pipe cleaner)
- Wiggle eyes
- Small pink pom-pom
- Thin wire
- Wire cutters
- Cardboard
- Scissors
- Glue
- Fabric or lace



How To Make It

- Glue cotton balls on a styrofoam egg for tail and feet.
- Bend white pipe cleaner around a thicker pink pipe cleaner for the ears.
- Add wiggle eyes, a small pink pom-pom nose and thin wire whiskers.
- Place on a cardboard circle with hole cut out for base of egg to rest in. The cardboard can be covered with fabric or lace.

Tips

Only put about 1/3 of a cotton ball for each of the legs on the bunny.

Cut the bottom off of the egg so it would sit up straight.

This is a very quick craft to make.

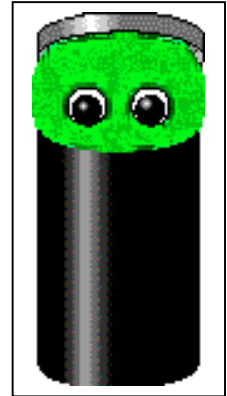
Grouch-In-a-Can

Being involved in Guiding, I work with varied age groups of girls and often look for simple, inexpensive crafts. This one is perfect for Brownies or Rainbows. It looks adorable!

This project is rated VERY EASY to do.

What You Need

- Empty black film canister with lid
- Large (2") green pom-pom
- 2 Wiggle eyes (7 mm)
- Tacky glue
- Short piece of narrow green ribbon (if you wish to hang it)
- Toothpick



How To Make It

- With toothpick run small amount of tacky glue around inside of film canister around top edge.
- Place green pompom into canister so that about 1/2 of pompom shows over top.
- With toothpick, spread tacky glue around underside of lid, then place on top of pompom slightly tilted back towards green hanging ribbon (if you plan on hanging it).
- With toothpick, spread small amount of tacky glue on eyes and stick onto ball.
- **There you have it - Grouch-In-a-Can!**

Pine Cone Bird Feeder

A fun craft for Brownies or Rainbows. The children will have fun watching the birds eat. Parental supervision is recommended.

This project is rated VERY EASY to do.

What You Need

- Pine cone
- Paper plate
- Butter knife
- Smooth peanut butter
- Birdseed
- Ribbon or yarn
- Scissors



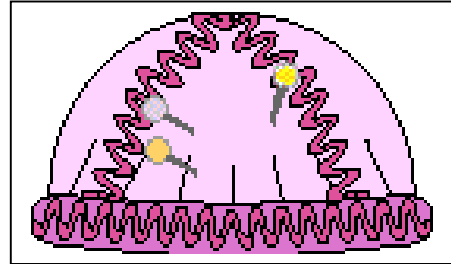
How To Make It

- Cut a long length of yarn or ribbon to hang the bird feeder.
- Tie the ribbon in a knot around the pine cone near the top (about 3 sections down).
- Tie a knot in the end of the ribbon.
- Use the knife to get a large clump of peanut butter on the paper plate.
- Use the knife to spread peanut butter inside the pine cone and around the edges.
- Sprinkle the birdseed over the pine cone.
- Roll the pine cone in the birdseed that is on the plate.
- Hang the bird feeder on the tree.
- Enjoy watching the birds eat their treat!

Styrofoam Pincushion

This project is rated **EASY** to do.
What You Need

- A Styrofoam ball, cut in half
- Tacky glue
- Felt
- A jar lid
- Lace, rick-rack, whatever for decorating



How To Make It

- Cut a circle of felt large enough to cover the round part of the styrofoam ball.
- Glue the felt to the ball at the bottom.
- Glue the ball into the jar lid.
- Decorate with lace, rick-rack, whatever around the jar lid. You may also want to decorate the ball with a crisscross-cross of ribbon or rick-rack. Tuck the ends into the jar lid.
- If desired, you can spray paint the jar lid prior to gluing in the covered ball half.

Handy Halloween Treat

Easy, inexpensive, and fun!

This project is rated VERY EASY to do.

What You Need

- Clear plastic gloves
- Candy corn or Hot Tamales candy
- Popcorn
- Orange and black ribbon
- Plastic spider rings



How To Make It

- Stuff a piece of candy corn in each finger of the clear plastic glove to resemble fingernails. If you wish, you can use red candy instead to resemble painted fingernails.
- Fill it with popcorn (no butter!)
- Tie it at the wrist with orange and black ribbon.
- Place a plastic spider ring on the ring finger.
